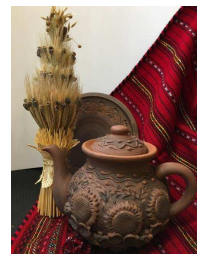

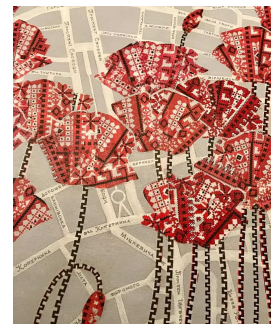

Transformation Art Exhibition

Transformation, an art exhibition by the Ukrainian Association of Visual Artists of Canada (USOM) opened on Saturday, November 16th and will run until February 16, 2020. The exhibition is open to the public with free admission. The exhibition of over 50 works by 29 member artists of USOM presents artwork with various interpretations of the title theme of "transformation" executed in a wide range of styles and techniques. The diversity of the artwork is a reflection of the interests of USOM's members, who come from different parts of Canada.

An exhibition catalogue, containing a message from USOM's president Oleh Lesiuk, an introduction by arts writer Halyna Kostiuk and reproductions of the artwork, is available. *Transformation* marks the first time that USOM will be presenting a themed exhibition originating at Oseredok and will be a part of its 75th anniversary celebrations.





Tradition to Modernity

Treasures from Oseredok's Collection

The new fifth-floor exhibition presents the impact of modernity -- through photography, art, sculpture, and performance. Photos from Oseredok's unique collection include images of the First World War brought to Canada by Ivan Bobersky, snap shots chronicling Ukrainian Canadian life, and studio photography. The art display ranges from landscape, portrait, religious, and genre painting to sculpture. Viewers learn about the contribution of Ukrainians to theatre, film, music, dance, and vaudeville. The focus in each case is on the development from iconic to innovatory, customary to iconoclastic. Some great names of Ukrainian art are on display: Oleksa Novakivsky, Ivan Trush, Mykola Nedilko, Halyna Mazepa, Maria Dolnytsky, Mykhailo Moroz, Myron Levytsky, and William Kurelek. Early icons from Ukraine can be viewed alongside those created by the first settlers in Canada. Modernist works by prominent Parisian artists of the 1920s like Oleksander Hryshchenko (Gritchenko) can be compared to those by later émigrés to the city like Mykola Krychevsky, Omelian Mazuryk, and Andriy Solohub. The tradition of graphic art is represented by interwar works of the Galician artist Olena Kulchytska, postwar graphic art produced in the USA by Jacques Hnizdovsky, and post-1960s prints by the Canadian artists Don Proch and Bill Lobchuk. The sculpture section contains works by classics like Hryhorii (Hryhor) Kruk, Antin Pavlos, and Leo Mol, and by contemporaries like Svitlana Muchin and Jean Bachynsky.

The creativity and contributions of these artists can be contrasted and compared with the Centre's extensive collection of traditional ornamental designs, which the *pysanka*, kilim, embroidery, and costume making have made famous. The exhibition introduces visitors to Oseredok's remarkable resources by displaying some of its oldest and newest acquisitions and by highlighting the process of cultural evolution under the impact of modernity.

The presentation will start with an illustrated overview of the work of the STCU - Science and Technology Centre of Ukraine. This large and important organization was established by the western powers (Canada, USA, European Union and Ukraine, - later joined by other countries) to convert Ukrainian scientists formerly involved with the USSR's development of weapons of mass destruction (nuclear, chemical, biological and systems of delivery of those weapons) to peaceful, economically useful research.

After a presentation and explanation of several interesting sample projects supported by the STCU, several non-standard "behind-the-scenes", and "non-official" situations will be mentioned.

The event was held on Sunday, September 22, 2019, in the impressive Bergman's on Lombard restaurant in downtown Winnipeg. Oseredok was honoured to receive such an award acknowledging the past 75 years of cultural preservation and promotion of Ukrainian history and culture.
