Legends about Pysanka

There are many legends about the first Easter eggs.

Christian and folk beliefs mingled and firmly attached the egg to Easter celebrations.

One of the legends is about the Virgin Mary, who gave eggs to the soldiers at the cross. She hoped that they would be less cruel to her son. She cried, and her tears dropping upon the eggs, turned bright colours.

Another legend is about Mary Magdalene who went to the tomb of Jesus with a basket of eggs. She uncovered the eggs when she approached the tomb. She was astonished because the white shells of the eggs became coloured.

One of the Ukrainian legends says that the world will exist as long as the egg decorating custom continues.

Ukrainian Embroidery

The Ukrainian art of embroidery has an ancient origin which reaches back to the Neolithic age. Embroideries were already known in the 2^{nd} century BC.

Initially, embroidery was an art of the ordinary people. Later it became more of a craft. The woven Byzantine fabrics had a great influence on the character of the embroidery. The embroidery on a white shirt of Ukrainians was mentioned by Byzantine writers in the XI-XII centuries. The famous drawings on miniatures and frescos in Ukraine are dated by the same period of time.

Spotlight on ...

One of the exhibits of Oseredok's current exhibition "Legacy of the Cossack Elite" is a Sash from Slutsk. This is a four part reversible sash richly woven with silk, gold and silver threads. It is a testament to the artistry of Jan Marzarski and the craftsmen of the Potocki textile factory in Stanyslaviv (presently Ivano-Frankiv'sk), and later Prince Radziwiłt's factory in Slutsk (presently in Belarus). The Cossack elite wore it folded in half lengthwise. The colour on the outside, or the gradation of colour, corresponded to the occasion attended: white or the lightest tones for weddings, red or a light tone for social occasions, grey or a darker tone for official functions, and black or the darkest tones for funerals.
