

On February 26, 2020, we welcomed and opened At the Front Line: Ukrainian Art, 2013-2019 an exhibit arriving from Mexico City. Curators Svitlana Biedarieva (Courtauld Institute of Art, University of London) and Hanna Deikun (Centre for Research and Teaching in Economics (CIDE), Mexico City) gave guests a detailed tour, discussing the meaning behind each section of the exhibit and shed light on the difficult themes surrounding the struggles in Ukraine.

At the Front Line explores how Ukrainian visual artists interpret and conceptualize the turbulent political and cultural situation in Ukraine over the past six years: from the civil protests in Kyiv (2013-2014) to the annexation of the Crimean Peninsula and the military conflict with Russia in the east of the country (2014-present). Using a variety of artistic mediums, the exhibition aims to engage its audience, helping us better understand the circumstances in Ukraine and how it relates to Canada.

#### ZENON HLUSZOK

All of his life, Zenon Hluszok has been an active volunteer. His parents, Iwan and Kateryna, were from a generation that was active in church, community and nationalist organizations both in Ukraine and in Canada. They inspired him to be a life-long volunteer.

As a young person Zenon was an active member with Ukrainian Youth Association, SUM [1957-2000] as a youth counselor, summer camp director, and Executive member, including President. He was an enthusiastic player, coach and Executive member

of IPAC Ukraine soccer organization, [1963 to 1993], later coaching his sons' teams as they grew up.

During his University of Manitoba days, he was an Executive member of the Ukrainian Students Club [USC] as well as a player on their inter-mural teams. Since 1971, Zenon has been a volunteer with Ukraine Kyiv Pavilion including holding various Executive positions such as Chairperson of Guest Services (Security) and Zabava, Exhibit Organizer and Pavilion Co-ordinator. Most recently, he has been involved with the Kyiv Pavilion 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary committee, as Archivist, Exhibit Organizer and on the 50th anniversary book sub-committee.

He was a founding Executive member [Treasurer 1986 – 1993] of Sadok Veselka Day Care, Winnipeg's only full time Ukrainian language day care, and the founding Treasurer [1986] of the Manitoba Ukrainian Arts Council [MUAC].

Zenon began his association with Oseredok in 1977 as a summer student, which grew into twenty years of employment as the Centre's Archivist [1979-1999]. While many of his duties required him to work after regular hours, there were many other related activities that he chose to give of his own time.

He represented Oseredok as a founding Executive member of the Association of Manitoba Archivists (AMA) [1980] and the Manitoba Council of Archives (MCA) [1986]. This initial involvement subsequently led to many more years as a volunteer Executive member, including Secretary and President of both associations. His dedicated volunteerism extended to being appointed and re-appointed in the nineties by the Province of Manitoba as the Archival community representative to two provincial heritage grant awarding agencies. HGAC and MGAC.

Zenon's most recent involvement with Oseredok was the orderly transfer of all the gifted cultural property located on the fifth floor into storage on the third and fourth floors. Upon completion, the Centre was able to rejuvenate the majority of the fifth floor space into a proper museum exhibit space. The first exhibit in this restored space celebrated Oseredok's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Currently Zenon is working on upgrading the Centre's archival storage space, and in creating an accurate museum artifact inventory database.

When asked why he volunteers at Oseredok, Zenon replied that he believes in the need for a strong Ukrainian community owned and operated museum in Winnipeg. He supports Oseredok by maintaining his membership and volunteering his time in the Archives, an area in which he is passionate about and has been most active in his whole life.
