General Duties and Responsibilities:

Reporting directly to the Curator of Collections and Exhibits, the Green Team Members will complete landscaping duties, ensure adherence with safety protocols, and complete light maintenance tasks on the exterior and interior of the building. The Green Team Members will also help with moving, reorganizing, and processing of Oseredok's collections.

Primary Responsibilities and Duties:

In accordance with Health & Safety regulations and Standard Operating Procedures Green Team Members will complete tasks which include but are not be limited to:

- The routine upkeep and maintenance of building as assigned. Duties may include priming, painting, repairs, and maintenance of the Oseredok building
- General green space maintenance and landscaping duties including gardening, lawn care, trimming and pruning of vegetation, removal of debris, etc.
- Managing collections including sorting, organizing, and moving museum items
- Assisting with tasks and activities directly related to regular programming and exhibits or seasonal events (including coordinating set-up or removal of temporary displays)
- Ensure that Oseredok meets all COVID-19 safety requirements by sanitizing and sterilizing as necessary
- Communicate any security and technical issues of any artwork, gallery equipment, of exhibition spaces to Oseredok staff
- Perform other duties as assigned
