To the Board of Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc.:

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc. (the "Foundation"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2020, and the statements of operations and changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Foundation as at December 31, 2020, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Foundation in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### **Other Matter**

The financial statements of the Foundation for the year ended December 31, 2019 were audited by another firm of chartered professional accountants, who expressed an unmodified opinion in their report dated July 17, 2020.

#### Other Information

Management is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the annual report, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon. The annual report is expected to be made available to us after the date of this auditor's report.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we will not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information identified above when it becomes available and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

When we read the annual report, if we conclude that there is a material misstatement therein, we are required to communicate the matter to those charged with governance.

#### Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Foundation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Foundation's financial reporting process.





#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud
  or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is
  sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material
  misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve
  collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that
  are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
  effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Foundation to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the
  disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a
  manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

# Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc. Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended December 31, 2020

#### 1. Incorporation and nature of the organization

Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc. (the "Foundation") operates as a not-for-profit organization and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act for the purpose of preserving and developing the culture, education and heritage of Ukrainian Canadians.

#### 2. Significant accounting policies

The financial statements of the Foundation have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations and include the following significant accounting policies:

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include balances with banks and short-term investments with maturities of three months or less. Cash subject to restrictions that prevent its use for current purposes is included in restricted cash.

#### Revenue recognition

The Foundation follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Endowment contributions are recognized as direct increases in net assets.

Interest income is recognized on a time proportional basis over the duration of the deposit.

#### Contributed materials

Contributions of materials and services are not recognized in the financial statements.

#### Financial instruments

The Foundation recognizes its financial instruments when the Foundation becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. All financial instruments are initially recorded at their fair value. At initial recognition, the Foundation may irrevocably elect to subsequently measure any financial instrument at fair value. The Foundation has not made such an election during the year. The Foundation subsequently measures its financial instruments at cost or amortized cost, except for investments that are quoted in an active market, which is recognised at fair value. Amortized cost is the amount at which the financial instrument is measured at initial recognition less principle repayments, plus or minus the cumulative of any difference between the initial amount and the maturity amount, and minus any reduction for impairment.

#### 5. Heritage - Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre Fund

Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation has partnered with The Winnipeg Foundation to establish this permanently endowed Manitoba Heritage Trust Fund to support the work of the Ukrainian Cultural and Education Centre ("the Centre").

Until March 31, 2021, the Province of Manitoba will stretch gifts to the this fund. Every \$2 given during this period has the potential to be stretched by an additional \$1, to a maximum of \$255,000.

Control of the fund assets resides with The Winnipeg Foundation and accordingly, this fund is not recorded as an asset in these financial statements. Gifts to this fund are invested in perpetuity and the annual income generated for grant making is distributed to the Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre. The Winnipeg Foundation will generate the tax receipts for all gifts directed to this fund under the Manitoba Heritage Trust Program. For the year ended December 31, 2020, the annual income distribution was nil (2019 - \$1.592).

### 6. Advances to related parties

The Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc. is governed by four directors of the Ukrainian National Federation St. Boniface Branch and three directors of the Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre Inc. (the "Centre"). The purpose of the Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Foundation Inc. is to provide funding to the Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre Inc. It has been the policy of the Foundation to distribute investment income to the Centre on an annual basis.

Funds distributed to the Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre Inc. during the current year were \$35,704 (2019 - \$37,794).

#### 7. Financial instruments

The Foundation, as part of its operations, carries a number of financial instruments. It is management's opinion that the Foundation is not exposed to significant interest, currency, credit, liquidity or other price risks arising from these financial instruments except as otherwise disclosed.

#### Interest rate risk

Interest rate cash flow risk is the risk that changes in market interest rates may have an effect on the cash flows associated with some financial instruments. Interest rate price risk is the risk that changes in market interest rates may have an effect on the fair value of other financial instruments. It is management's opinion that the Foundation is exposed to interest rate price risk due to its investment in fixed rate term deposits. However, management does not deem this risk to be significant.

#### Credit risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Foundation to credit risk and concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash and accounts receivable. Management manages credit risk associated with accounts receivable by pursuing collections when they are due.

#### 8. Significant event

During the year, there was a global outbreak of COVID-19 (coronavirus), which has had a significant impact on businesses through the restrictions put in place by the Canadian, provincial, and municipal governments regarding travel, business operations and isolation/quarantine orders. At this time, it is unknown the extent of the impact the COVID-19 outbreak may have on the Foundation as this will depend on future developments that are highly uncertain and that cannot be predicted with confidence. These uncertainties arise from the inability to predict the ultimate geographic spread of the disease, and the duration of the outbreak, including the duration of travel restrictions, business closures or disruptions, and quarantine/isolation measures that are currently, or may be put in place by Canada and other countries to fight the virus.

#### 9. Comparative figures

Certain comparative figures have been reclassified to conform with current year presentation.
