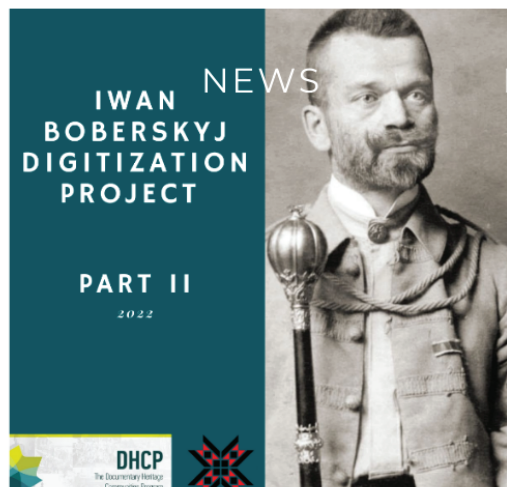

The Iwan Boberskyj Digitization Project Part II



The Iwan Boberskyj collection is a unique visual source of pioneer life in the Prairies and Winnipeg at the beginning of the 20th century. This collection contains over 6,200 photographs taken between 1920-1929 by Iwan Boberskyj, a Ukrainian diplomat who toured Western Canada fundraising for Ukrainian orphans and widows on behalf of the Ukrainian Red Cross.

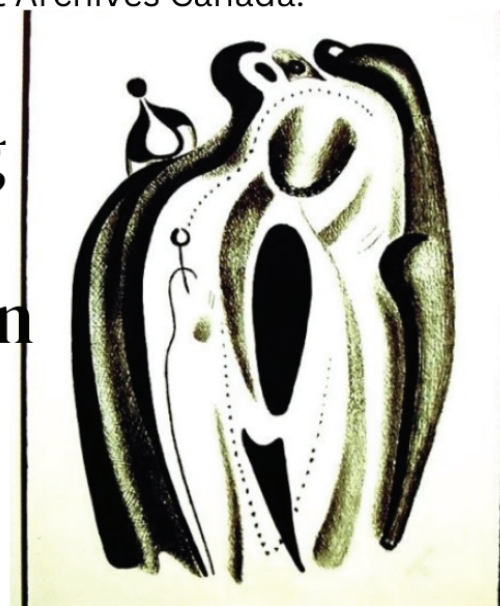
A conclusive Part 2 of the Iwan Boberskyj Digitization Project is underway. Half of the Iwan Boberskyj collection has already been digitized and soon the entire collection will be publicly accessible in three languages: Ukrainian, French, and English via our Online Catalog. The Olexander Koshetz Digitization Project



Oseredok has recently undertaken another project of great historical value. The project aims to digitize the Olexander Koshetz collection, which contains unique musical and ethnographical material with over nine linear meters of textual materials and over 1500 photographs. Olexander Koshetz was a composer, choirmaster, ethnographer, and cultural diplomat. A leading popularizer of Ukrainian folk songs and liturgical music, Koshetz composed five liturgies, arranged numerous folk songs, and published many collections and musical studies. This project has been made possible by the Government of Canada.

Fine Art Cataloging and Digitization Project Part 1

With almost 1000 fine art pieces in Oseredok's collections and growing, we decided it is time to make them digitally available to everyone via our Online Catalog. Part 1 of the project aims to improve storage organization, digitize, and catalog at least half of the Oseredok Fine Art collection. Our collection holds an exquisite representation of various fine art genres such as portraiture, landscape, religious art, illustrations, nudes, mixed media, naïve art, folk art, abstract art, cartoons, etc. This project has been made possible in part by the Canadian Museums Association.

Art Donations for art auction

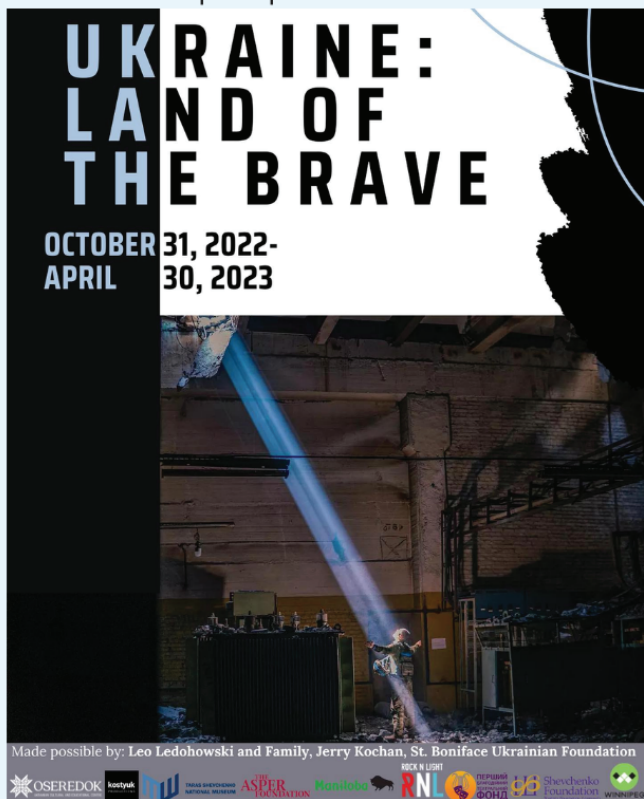

The Immersive World of Ukrainian Art

October 31, 2022 -

This double-feature immersive exhibition has two distinct areas of focus: The Immersive World of Ukrainian Art/Імерсивний Світ Українського Мистецтва is a family-friendly exhibition which celebrates the creative achievements of Ukrainians from around the world. Ukraine: Land of the Brave/Україна: Земля Хоробрих is recommended for audiences 16+ as the exhibition focuses on Russia's invasion of Ukraine and includes imagery which may not be suitable for younger audiences. Visit Oseredok's galleries for the chance to explore both of these free exhibitions this fall!

Immersive exhibitions combine modern multimedia technologies with traditional ones to allow the visitor to immerse themselves in sound, light, and imagery. At 30 minutes in length each, The Immersive World of Ukrainian Art/Імерсивний Світ Українського Мистецтва and Ukraine: Land of the Brave/Україна: Земля Хоробрих, are the most ambitious Ukrainian immersive exhibitions to debut in North America, representing the hard work of many individuals in Canada, Ukraine, and around the world.

The Immersive World of Ukrainian Art/Імерсивний Світ Українського Мистецтва features animated representations of artwork set to original musical compositions. The artworks featured represent some of Ukraine's most significant and acclaimed artists, such as Taras Shevchenko, who is considered by many to be Ukraine's most famous artist, and Maria Prymachenko, the artist Pablo Picasso called "an artistic miracle". The exhibition will also feature artworks from Oseredok's museum, archival, and fine art collections, showcasing items not previously on display to the public.

In Ukraine: Land of the Brave/Україна: Земля Хоробрих, visitors will have the opportunity to hear the voices of ordinary Ukrainians under the extraordinary circumstance of being plunged into war. The exhibition features footage captured by journalists and photographers such as Sergey Loiko and Dmytro Kozatsky, whose work on the front lines has given a human face to this conflict, as well as materials from leading Ukrainian media channels.

The evocative visuals in this exhibition are combined with an original score by composer Timur Polyanskiy. Polyanskiy took inspiration from various style of music from classical, to Ukrainian folk songs, to jazz, to the renowned scores of Olexander Koshetz, one of Oseredok's founding members, to create an unforgettable auditory experience.
