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Oseredok Collections / Bictiz Konekyin

Oseredok works hard to make our collections accessible to everyone. We have recently completed the second part of our **Library Cataloging Project**, focused on processing our Ukrainian Canadian Diaspora Collection.

According to our estimates, this collection has over 10,000 books. With this project, we have cataloged 1,500 books and almanacs so far! Through our Online Catalog, you can browse over 2,800 books.





This Summer, we started work on the Fine Art Cataloging and Digitization Project Part 2. During the project, our Museum Intern digitized and cataloged over 350 artworks so far and helped us organize our primary art storage space.

All cataloged and digitized artworks are available to explore through our Online Catalog, which currently has over 680 items.

The Museum Cataloging Project Part 3, which started recently, aims to complete the digitization and cataloging of Oseredok's textile collection, including our oversized artifacts such as kylymy, embroidered tablecloths, banners, etc.

So far, we have processed over 370 artifacts, including embroidered blouses and shirts, skirts, dresses, pillowcases, sashes, vests, and neckties, to name a few.
